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Teacher Support

Teacher Support program aims to improve the professional abilities and performances of teachers through training, recognition to outstanding teachers and supplementing the efforts of teachers through volunteer teachers in schools.

Activities in the Teacher Support Program



Training and re-training of teachers.



Recognition to outstanding teachers with the Nation Builder Awards to encourage them to perform better.



Supplemental teaching through volunteer teachers, who will provide subject support and extra-curricular activity sessions in schools.

E-learning

The E-learning program aims at improving the quality of teaching and learning through the use of Curriculum based audio visual modules in local languages.

RILM's 'E-Shiksha' module includes projector/TV and audio visual content mapped with state board curriculum in vernacular languages. This single classroom installation is affordable and of high quality.

Adult Literacy

The Adult Literacy program seeks to impart functional literacy to non-literate adults above the age of 15 and subsequently engage young literate adults in skill development training.

Approaches under the program

DIKSHA - It aims to identify student-volunteers from schools/colleges who will impart functional literacy to non-literate adults on an one-to-one basis over a period of 45-60 days.

SWABHIMAAN - Dignity through education
It envisions setting up Swabhimaan Centres (SC) across India, where a trained teacher will impart functional literacy to a group of non-literate adults over a period of 90-120 days.

RILM's skills development initiative aims to capacitate the adults by building new skills or enhancing existing skills to strengthen their employability, help them attain a sustainable livelihood.

Child Development

The Child Development program, also known as Asha Kiran... a ray of hope, aims to bring out-of-school children back to schools. As of now the Asha Kiran program is being implemented across 13 states and 1 Union Territory of India in partnership with 33 NGOs.

Asha Kiran children are those aged between 7 to 14 years who :



Have never been to school, or



Have not been attending school (irregular or absent) for at least more than 45 days without any information to school, or



Laggard in comparison to his/her age appropriate learning abilities
